- 1. Read Joshua Chapter 17. Was Manasseh the first or second born of Joseph, in v. 1? What kind of a man was Makir, son of Manasseh? What were the names of the two sons of Makir? How many daughters had Zelophehad? Who was the first born of Joseph?

How many portions did Manasseh receive, in v. 5? Where were the daughters of Manasseh's portion? What did the rest of Manasseh's sons receive, in v. 6?

Instead of driving out the Canaanites what did the children of Israel do to them, in v. 13?

What did the children of Joseph complain to Joshua that they were given only one lot and one portion to inherit, in v. 14? What country did Joshua tell the children of Joseph to go up to when they wanted more room, in v. 15? What did Joshua tell Joseph's children to do if they were a great people? What did Joshua tell the children of the house of Joseph they would have for their territory beside one lot, in v. 18?

What did Joseph's children say the Canaanites in the valley had, in v. 16? Who had chariots of iron? What lessons do you learn from this chapter?

2. Read Joshua Chapter 18. Where did the whole congregation of the children of Israel assemble and set up the tabernacle, in v. 1? How many tribes had not received their inheritance when Israel assembled there? What important point did Joshua make in v. 3? How many men from each tribe were sent out to go through the land and bring back a description to Joshua, in v. 4?

Into how many parts would the described land be divided? What tribe would live at the most southern border of the Promised Land? What group would live at the most northern border of the Promised Land? See Josh 18:5.

Who divided the land by lots among the last seven tribes and who had not received their inheritance of land? Before whom was the casting of lots for land for an inheritance of the last seven tribes? What were the spies supposed to bring back? See Josh 18:6.

What was stated as the inheritance for the Levite tribe, in v. 17? Which tribes had already received their inheritance on the east side of Jordan? Who had given the inheritance of land on the east side of Jordan to God, the tribes of Reuben and half the tribe of Manasseh? Where did Joshua cast lots before the Lord to divide the land for the last seven tribes? See Josh 18:7-8.

When the three men from each of the seven tribes walked through the land and described it by cities, in what did they record their findings, in v. 9?

Which tribe received the first lot when the land was divided among the last seven tribes, in v. 11? How many cities were there that were Benjamin's inheritance, in v. 28? What lessons do you learn from this chapter?

3. Read Joshua Chapter 20. Joshua to have the children of Israel appoint, and for what were the cities of refuge to be used, in vv. 2-3?

When a person who had killed another arrived at a city of refuge, who was he to tell or declare his cause, in v. 4? How long would the slayer have to stay in the refuge city, in v. 5? When the high priest of a refuge city died what happened to the slayer? What were the elders to do after hearing the case of a person who had come to a city of refuge after unwittingly killing another person? What were the elders of the city of refuge to do if the unwittingly killer was pursued? Why were the elders of the city of refuge not supposed to deliver the man who had killed unwittingly into the hands of his pursuers? See Josh 20:4-5.

Name the three cities on the west side of Jordan, which were appointed to be cities of refuge, in v. 7, and give their location. Name the three cities of refuse on the east side of the Jordan River which were appointed to be cities of refuge, in v. 8, and give their location. 9. Read I Samuel Chapter 13. After Saul had reigned as king for two years, how many men were drafted for military" duty, in vv. 1-2? How many soldiers were with Saul in Mishmash and in Mount Bethel? How many soldiers were with Jonathan in Gibeah in Benjamin? Who attacked the garrison of the Philistines in Geba, in v. 3? Who saw to it that the people of his own nation heard that the Philistine's military post at Geba had been attacked? Who held the Israelites as obnoxious as they gathered together with Saul at Gilgal, in v. 4? How many chariots, horsemen and people of the Philistines gathered at Mishmash to battle Saul and Israel at Gilgal, in vv. 4-5?

When the men of Israel at Gilgal saw the military strength of the Philistines at Mishmash they were frightened. In which did places they seek shelter from their enemies, in vv. 5-7? While some of the frightened Israelites were hiding from the Philistine army at Mishmash, describe the condition of the remaining people with Saul at Gilgal, in vv. 5-7.

How many days had Saul waited for Samuel at Gilgal, according to v. 8? Who offered a burnt offering and peace offering at Gilgal instead of Samuel the prophet of God, in v. 9? Who appeared on the scene as Saul was finishing the burnt offering at Gilgal, in v. 10? For what reason did Saul go out to meet Samuel as he approached him at Gilgal? What were the three reasons Saul gives to Samuel when he asks, "What have you done?" when Saul offered the burnt offerings at Gilgal, in v.

11? What did Saul tell Samuel at Gilgal he was compelled to offer at Gilgal before Samuel's arrival, in v. 12?

Because of Saul 's sin in offering the burnt offering at Gilgal, instead of waiting for Samuel, what does Samuel say will be taken from him and given to a man after the Lord's own heart, in vv. 13-14? After Samuel's prediction of Saul losing the kingdom of Israel and his departure, what did Saul do in v. 15?

10. Read I Samuel Chapter 14. Summarize Jonathan's attack on the Philistines in vv. 1-14. How many men did Jonathan and his armor-bearer kill in the first attack, in v. 14? How did the Lord help Israel against the Philistines in vv. 14-15? Who was credited with the success of Israel, in v. 23?

As the battle progressed beyond Bethaven, what order did Saul give that distressed the men of Israel, in vv. 23-23? Jonathan felt his father was wrong in charging the people not to eat the day they battled the Philistines. What does Jonathan say would have been greater, in vv. 29-30? As the Philistines fled before Israel they took three kinds of animals and ate them. Name them. How did the people of Israel sin when they ate the animals, in v. 32?

What two requests did Saul make from the people of Israel when he learned they had sinned in eating the blood of the animals, in vv. 32-25? As the sacrifice was offered for the sin of the people of Israel who ate the blood of the animals, what three things does Saul propose to do to the Philistines with the approval of the people, in vv. 35-36? Who suggested they should seek God's counsel before going against the Philistines

after the children of Israel sinned in eating the blood of the animals, in v. 36? As the children of Israel offered sacrifice for their sin of eating blood what was God's answer to Saul when he asked God if he would deliver the Philistines into their hands, in v. 37?

When Saul failed to receive an answer from God at the sacrifice for the sin of eating blood who did he instruct to find out what sin had been committed that day, in v. 38? What rash vow did Saul make when he called the leaders nearer to him, in v. 39? As the people of Israel stood on one side and Saul and Jonathan on the other, Saul asked God to give a perfect lot. Upon whom did the first lot fall, in vv.40-41? When the lot was cast between Saul and Jonathan who was taken, in v. 42? Who was willing to die because he tasted a little honey from the end of a rod, in v. 43?
